





Data Access Arrangement - A protective connecting arrangement for use with the network control signalling unit, or in lieu of the connecting arrangement, an arrangement to identify a central office line and protective facilities and procedures to assure compliance with criteria set forth in this Tariff.

Direct Inward Dialing (DID) - A service provided to PBX customers which allows callers to dial from the public network straight to an internal extension without intervention by an operator.

Directory Listing - Essential information in the telephone directory or information records of the Company whereby telephone users may ascertain the telephone number and/or service address of a listed customer.

It usually embraces a city, town, or village or unincorporated community and environs thereto and may consist of one or more central offices, together with the associated plant used in furnishing service within that area.

Malicious Call Trap Service - A line with this class of service can "trap" a calling malicious party. The "trapped" party can no longer terminate the call and the called party may dial a third party. A NOTE message is also printed at the central office for every incoming call to enable the identification of calling parties.

Message - A completed telephone call.

Message Toll Service - Telecommunications service between exchanges for which a toll rate is charged.

Minimum Contract Period - The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment, whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

Network Interface Device - The associated equipment located at the customer's premises at which an access line terminates.

Off-Premises Station - A telephone located in a different office or building from the main telephone system. Local special access rates apply to off-premises stations when the circuit is provided by the company.

One-Party Service - A grade of exchange service furnished by means of an exchange access central office line arranged to serve one primary station only, although additional stations may be connected to the line as extensions.

Permanent Disconnect - A service is permanently disconnected when the customer's service has been totally discontinued.

1. Provision and Ownership of Facilities

Company

Except as otherwise provided in these tariffs, the Company will, at its own expense, furnish, install and maintain all facilities for basic service, to the point of demarcation, necessary to serve applicants or customers in accordance with its filed tariffs.

9. Special Contracts

The rates and charges quoted in the tariff of the Company contemplate the use of service arrangements in quantities and types regularly furnished by the Company. 1. Establishment of Credit

General

Each applicant for service will be required to establish credit before service is provided. When the applicant's credit is satisfactory to the Company, no advance payment will be required, only a guarantee deposit. If an applicant's credit is not satisfactory, an advance payment and guarantee deposit will be required as stated in the Payment Arrangements section.

New Applicants

Applicants for service who have had no previous account with the Company may establish credit by supplying credit references acceptable to the Company. When the application is for permanent service and the credit references are acceptable, no advance payment will be required. 2. Discontinuance of Service for Failure to Establish or Maintain Credit

Service to a customer may be disconnected for failure to establish or maintain credit after a reasonable time, but in any case not until 10 days after written notice to the customer was mailed or delivered to his address as listed with the Company, or to the premises at which the service is rendered. Notice will be deemed given to the customer upon being posted.

3. Unpaid Account

- a. The Company is not obligated to furnish service to any individual or firm that owes for service previously rendered at the same or a different location, until arrangements have been made to liquidate such previous indebtedness to the Company.

1. Advance Payments

Applicants for service may be required to make an advance payment in addition to a guarantee deposit at the time of application equal to any non-recurring charges and the initial period charges for the service provided in addition to any deposit required. The amount of such advance payment is credited to the customer's account as applying to any indebtedness under the Company's tariff.

c. Amount of Deposit

The maximum deposit for new service shall not exceed an amount estimated to equal charges for two months' service billings, including toll charges.

After service has been established and experience demonstrates that the amount of the outstanding deposit is not suitable to safeguard the interest of the Company, the Company may require an adjustment of the deposit to cover the amount of service, including toll charges, for a two consecutive month period within the last twelve month period.

6. Disputed Bills

In the event of a dispute involving a customer's bill, the customer's service shall not be disconnected for non-payment of that portion of the bill under dispute pending an investigation by the Company. A. General

Basic Exchange Telecommunications Radio Service (BETRS) is a wireless system providing basic telephone service. BETRS is an alternative that may be applied in lieu of cable services at the Company's discretion. It provides radio coverage replacement for the local loop.

Each customer has a subscriber termination end which receives and transmits signals over voice channels provided by UHF and VHF radio frequencies. The subscriber termination end connects with the existing house wiring and supports standard telephone handsets and most other customer premises equipment.

Since BETRS is typically used for more remote applications, the Company may schedule periodic visits for installation and maintenance or service outages.

AC outlet or a 12 volt DC connection, at the point designated by the Company. It is also the customer's responsibility to provide a dry location where the temperature is kept above 32 degrees fahrenheit.
3. BETRS requires an acceptable signal receive level, as determined by the Company, to operate. If a tower structure, mast or other special construction is required for installation to achieve an acceptable signal level, it is the responsibility of the customer to provide such fixtures in compliance with Company specifications. If the required tower structure, mast or special construction is provided by the Company, it will be billed to the customer on a time and materials basis.
4. The Company will provide and maintain the necessary subscriber station equipment and antennas normally provided for the provision of BETRS service, provided that such equipment is located at a premises which has maintained road access or is accessible by 4-wheel drive truck.

Business Local Access Service - Simple and Complex Service

A. General

Simple and Complex Business Local Access Service is provided to customers through facilities owned and maintained by the Company in accordance with established standards.

Business service is provided to customers whose actual or obvious predominant use is of a business, professional, institutional or otherwise occupational nature.

B. Regulations

Subject to the availability and provisions of the Company's tariff, the type of business service provided to the customer is based on the number of lines provided.

1. Business service is defined as "simple" when the customer subscribes to no more than three exchange access lines.
